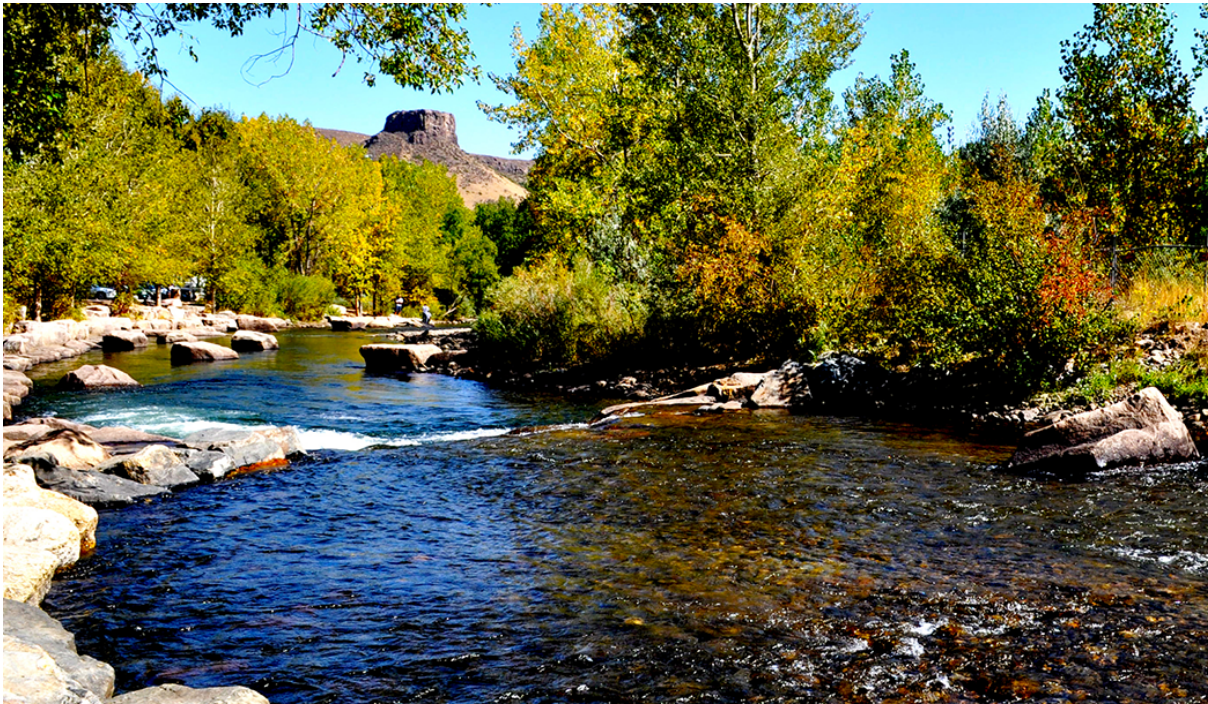
## **Golden Moves to a Stage One Fire Ban**

City of Golden and Jefferson County Sheriff's Office have issued a Stage 1 Fire Restriction.

Permitted activities include using liquid or gas-fueled appliances, approved wood pellet grills, charcoal BBQs 30 feet from undeveloped areas, and portable outdoor fireplaces 15 feet from dwellings. Welding and cutting torch appliances must be 30 feet from undeveloped areas. Fire department training fires and certain industrial and official fire suppression activities are also allowed. Adequate measures to prevent uncontrolled fires are required.

Building, maintaining, attending, or using any fire or recreational campfire, except a recreational fire within a permanently constructed fire grate in a developed park, campground, private residence, or picnic area, are prohibited.

## Clear Creek Update

This past weekend was Buffalo Bill Days in Golden, traditionally one of the busiest weekends of the summer, and this year was no exception. Saturday, being the longest day of the festival, saw the most attendees, with an estimated 13,000 people attending, 540 of whom used shuttles instead of parking downtown.

On the Creek Corridor, the busiest day was Sunday, with an estimated 6,125 pedestrians on the pathway and 5,195 people tubing. Tube rentals were not permitted Saturday to provide an offset for the anticipated peak that is associated with a City special event permit. One major rescue occurred on the creek in the last week; the City reminds you that even when green the creek can be mean and recommends connecting with Creek Ambassadors, and local outfitters, and reviewing safety measures on [visitgolden.com](http://visitgolden.com) in preparation of tubing on the creek.
