Clear Creek Update

This past weekend was busy in Golden with both the Fine Arts Festival and Freshmen Move-In Day at Colorado School of Mines. Approximately 9,200 people attended the Arts Festival on Saturday and Sunday. The Free Shuttle for special events had 161 riders throughout the weekend, but traffic was notably higher.

With impending stormy weather and a lower creek flow, the Creek had much fewer users than in weeks prior, with 2,219 tubers and 3,420 pedestrians on Saturday, the busiest weekend day.

Creek tubers should keep in mind that the water is now quite shallow, meaning you may need to carry your tube in places and navigate around more rocks protruding from the water. Injuries can still occur even when the water flow is low, especially cuts and scrapes from rocks.

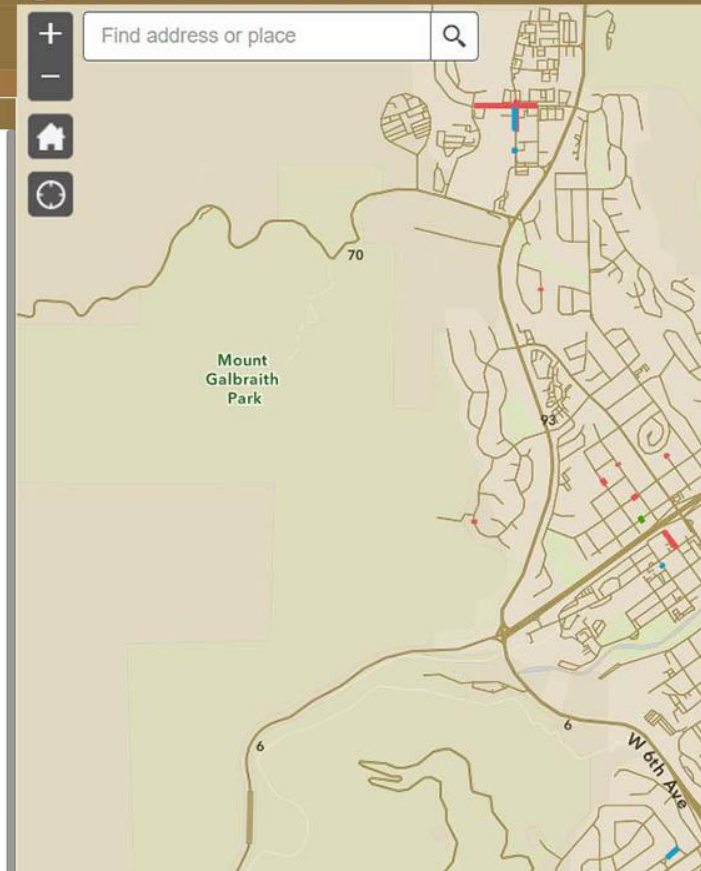
