Goltra Fire in Clear Creek Canyon

Yesterday, a fire ignited near Lookout Mountain due to a lightning strike. The fire continued to grow significantly overnight and was monitored by fire and law enforcement throughout the night. Additional resources have been ordered for a greater presence and impact this morning. Clear Creek Canyon is completely closed. Jefferson County Sheriff's Office will announce a morning media briefing as soon as they have more detailed information to share. Golden Fire deployed a resource yesterday to fight the fire; we are working closely with JeffCo Open Space as part of a unified command. If you are not signed up for Lookout Alert, please do so to stay informed.

The Grant-Terry Trail along the North side of the creek at the Highway 6 pedestrian bridge heading west is closed until further notice.

Fire Restricion Moved to Stage 1

The City of Golden is moving from a Stage 2 to a Stage 1 Fire Ban. Here's what you can still do under Stage 1 fire restrictions:

- Use liquid or gas-fueled appliances
- Use approved wood pellet grills
- Charcoal BBQ grills are allowed, but must be at least 30 feet away from undeveloped areas (2021 IFC 308.1.6)
- Portable outdoor fireplaces are allowed for one- and two-family dwellings, but must be at least 15 feet away from any dwelling or combustible material (2021 IFC 307.4.3)
- Welding and cutting torch appliances can be operated, as long as they are at least 30 feet away from undeveloped areas (2021 IFC 308.1.6)
- Fire Department/District training fires are permitted
- Burning of explosive wastes by manufacturers in zoned industrial areas, supervised by the fire protection district, is allowed
- Open fires or burning by federal, state, or local officers during official fire suppression duties are allowed

Remember: Safety first! Always take proper precautions to prevent uncontrolled fires, such as:

- Keeping containers of water or dry soil nearby
- Having shovels, fire extinguishers, or other extinguishing agents on hand
- Coordinating with your local fire department to be on standby during activities

A Portion of the C-470 Trail Is Closed Through November 19

A portion of the C-470 Trail will be closed through November 19. The trail is being re-routed to South Rooney Road to West Colfax Avenue as part of the **Overlook Development**. Trail users will not be able to access West 4th Avenue or the neighborhood connection to South Rogers Way. Access to the Box-O-Rox trail will remain open. 
Clear Creek Update

While summer is coming to a close and school is beginning, the creek has continued to see steady numbers of visitors. This past weekend was move-in at Colorado School of Mines, drawing many students and their families to the creek. This and late summer visitors contributed to a spike from the week prior. The Code Enforcement team issued 20 tickets over the weekend, bringing the summer's total to date to 418. No serious accidents have been reported on the creek in the last week, but Ambassadors and Code Enforcement Officers noticed an increase in small scrapes and bruises correlated with the lower water levels of late summer.

Concrete Replacement Program


