Ore Cart Updates for the First CSM Football Game of the Season

Before the game (starting two hours pre-game)

- Gold Route (downtown circulator) will add a stop in front of Marv Kay Stadium (12th Street) for fans headed to the game.
- Silver Route (Mines campus) will run clockwise starting at 4 p.m., adding stops at Marv Kay Stadium and the Y/H Lot on Elm Street for overflow ADA parking. Silver Route buses will not stop at K Lot.
- Tungsten Route (W Line) will add a stop in front of Marv Kay Stadium

Post-game (starting approximately 6:30 p.m.)

The Ore Cart will run later than normal service specifically for the game to help get people home and ease congestion downtown:

- Gold Route (downtown circulator) will stop in front of Marv Kay Stadium for fans leaving the game and heading downtown.
- Silver Route (Mines campus) will resume its normal route direction (counterclockwise). Buses will stop in front of Marv Kay Stadium and Y/H Lot before continuing to Mines Park. No service to K Lot.
- Tungsten Route (W Line) will stop in front of Marv Kay Stadium for fans leaving the game and heading to the light rail station/downtown.

Clear Creek Update

While Labor Day weekend marks the end of the official Creek Season at the City, this past weekend was busy downtown and along the creek. The Creek Corridor and City Parks saw high usage and activity Saturday through Monday. This was accompanied by over 40 code violations and the City Code Enforcement team was hard at work ensuring that visitors were well-educated about the community rules and expectations for recreating around town.

In the following weeks, residents can expect to see a decrease in activity on the creek and the removal of the green flags signaling creek status. The parking lot dedicated to tubing drop-offs on the south side of 10th Street next to the baseball fields will return to its off-season regulations by this Friday, September 6.

This will be the final weekly creek update for the season, but residents interested in reviewing the after-summer reports can attend the October 8 City Council Study Session, beginning at 5 p.m. See you next season!


