## **Christmas Tree Recycling**

The City of Golden offers a simple and eco-friendly way to dispose of your Christmas tree—by giving it a second life as mulch! Until January 31, you can drop off your tree at our new collection site located at **230 Depot St.**, near the intersection of **10th** and **Vasquez**. The site is open daily from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

To participate, please ensure your tree meets the following guidelines:

- Remove all ornaments, hardware, strings of lights, and tinsel.
- Only live Christmas trees will be accepted.
- Wreaths, tree branches, trash bags, or other wood materials will not be accepted.

The collected trees will be turned into mulch, which will be available for free pickup later at the public site on 11th St., just west of the Clear Creek History Park.



## **Ulysses Park Redevelopment Project**

The Ulysses Skatepark will be closed until mid-February due to construction in the north parking lot and surrounding areas. This closure ensures public and contractor safety while allowing work on the new dog park to progress efficiently.


East Street & Ford Street corridors from 13th Street to 23rd Street
